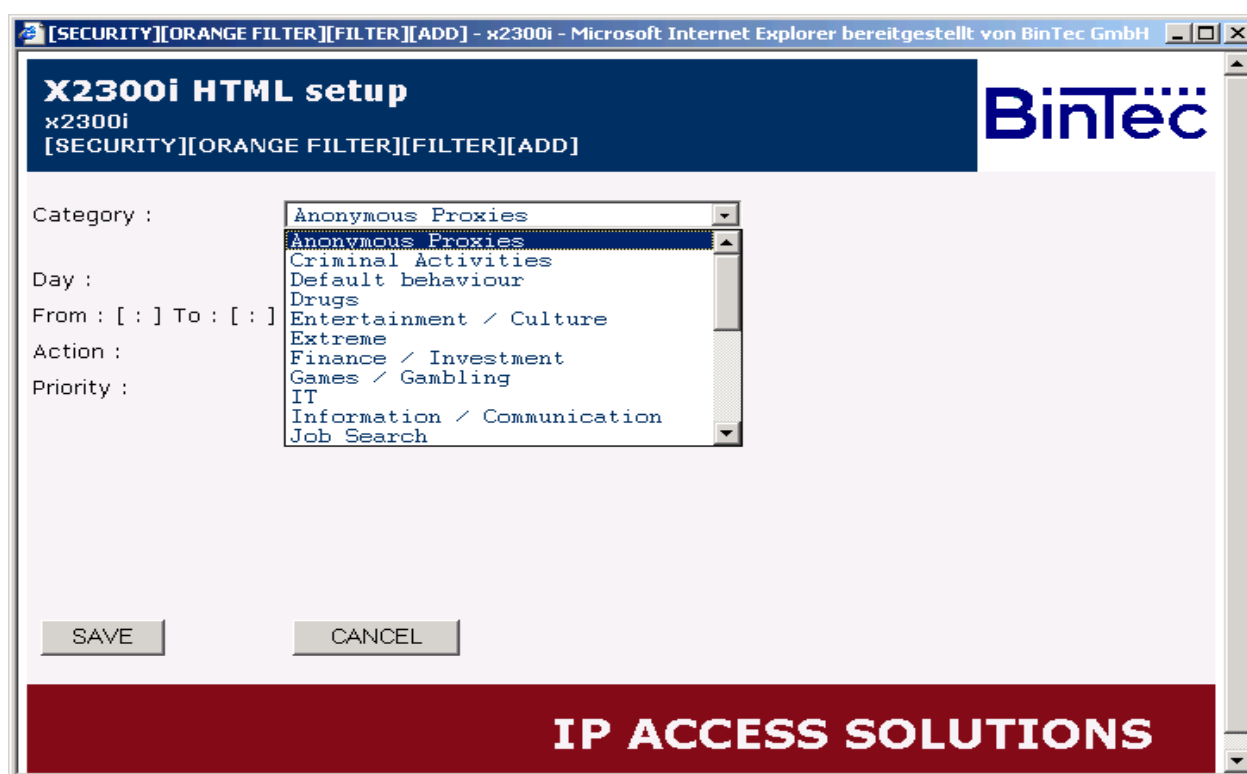


Bintec Solution – Content Filtering 2:

Using Bintec devices to block certain website categories

Starting with Release 7.1, most Bintec routers and VPN gateways offer an option to use content filtering. All the user is required to do is to activate the content filtering function in the router configuration. A 30-day trial license is available to allow users to thoroughly explore the advantages and benefits of this solution. Once the trial period has expired, customers can purchase a license from Cobion/ISS, after which the license key is entered in the router. If the content filter is activated but there is no valid license, the router will switch to a default setting that allows no Internet traffic at all. This can be prevented, however, by altering the configuration (i.e. deactivating the content filtering function).



The content filtering function in Bintec routers and VPN gateways can be used to block up to 17 different categories: Anonymous Proxies, Auctions/Online Ordering, Criminal Activities, Drugs, Entertainment/Culture, Extreme, Finance/Investment, Games/Gambling, Information/Communication, IT, Job Search, Lifestyle, Medicine, Nudity, Society/Education/Religion, Transport and Weapons.

It is also possible to block categories in general, but still allow access to certain pages. The category 'Auctions/Online Ordering' might be blocked, for example, but access to a single website, such as www.ebay.de, can still be allowed. This website is entered into a so-called white list and can be accessed even though the corresponding category is blocked.
